the day that support given to victims of modern slavery and trafficking ends

Potential victims of modern slavery are entitled to a 45 day 'rest and reflection period' when the Home Office is deciding their case. Once a decision has been reached victims have either 14 days or 48 hours (depending on the decision) to find accommodation and move out of the safe house

Upon leaving the safe house, no more Government support is provided and victims often struggle to find accommodation and work 2

Because of their vulnerable situation, many are targeted by human traffickers again and are left in worse situations

The lack of support is costly in the long run because survivors' situations often deteriorate to the point of needing a great deal of assistance



The Government acknowledged the need for post-safe house support and integration services in 2014.



## **UK TRAFFICKING VICTIMS**

In the UK in 2015, 3,266 people were identified as potential victims of trafficking.



30% of identified trafficking victims were children.
